Viewer (noun): someone who watches something particularly television.

Most of the viewers get stuck in front of the TV.



Discussion (noun): is a kind of programme in which people talk about something and tell each other their opinions. Discussion programmes on TV are very boring I hate watching them.







Commercial (noun): an advertisement on TV. (advert) Sometimes commercials are more interesting than TV programmes.

Contestant (noun): a person who competes in a competition or contest. This time, the contestants in the quiz show are very young.

Couch potato (noun): someone who spends a lot of time sitting and watching TV. After his retirement, my grandfather became a real couch potato.





Cartoon (noun): a short film that is made by photographing a series of drawings. My favourite cartoon character is Mickey Mouse.



Television





Director (noun): is a person who tells the actors how to play their parts Romi Hanson is a famous film director in Hollywood.

Documentary (noun): a television programme that gives information and facts about a specific subject. We watched a documentary on dolphins in the science lesson.



Educational (adjective): teaching you something you didn't know before and providing education. Programmes for children should be educational.



News (noun): information and reports about recent events all around the world. Have you seen the news about the earthquake?



Nonsense (noun): something said, done or written that is stupid or silly. The new reality shows are nonsense; they are a waste of time.



Quiz show (noun): a television program during which people compete with each other by trying to answer questions. Who wants to be a millionaire is a popular quiz show in Turkey.



Recommend (noun): to advise someone to do something The educators never recommend children watch this programme.







Remote control (noun): a small device that is used to operate a television from a distance by using electronic signals.

Could you pass the remote control? I want to change the channel.

Series (noun): a set of television programmes that have the same characters or deal with the same type of subject, and are usually broadcast every week on the same day. Lost is one of the best TV series I have ever watched.

Sitcom (noun): a funny television programme in which the same characters appear in different situations mostly at the same place each week. I don't like sitcoms because they are monotonous.



Talk show (noun): chat show, a television show in which famous people answer questions about themselves. My aunt is a famous actress and she hates being on talk shows.



Zap (verb): to change channels on a television by using the remote control. As we are watching TV, my dad is always zapping and I hate this.




